#### **ARCHIVED ARTICLE**

#### A TRUE CHRISTMAS STORY by Terry T. President Spearhead 1991 - 1993

Because it's the Christmas season, I decided to write something different for this issue. It was the HAC "Bring a Toy for a Kid" party that made up my mind for me. I think we all had a great time selecting a toy, bringing it to CHAT Hall and seeing what a great collection we'd acquired. I even overheard several people say that they wished they had known about the toy bit, because they would have liked to bring one too. Guess they were CHAT Saturday regulars who hadn't seen the posters.

As great as we felt at collecting that huge mound of toys, none of us will 'be able to experience the pleasure of seeing a kid open a package without a particular "admission price" in it. We will not see his or her eyes, nor will we probably ever know who it was who got our gift. Of course, it's the pleasure of giving that really matters in this case.

I was once in the position of distributing similar gifts- I've never told this story before .... Perhaps I should have, it would have helped the guys that collected the toys to really know the pleasure they brought to some kids. So, instead of my usual fantasy, I'd like to relate the story to you.

Many years ago, 1954 to be honest, I was a young Minister in charge of a mission in the Winnipeg slums. My organization was the Salvation Army and as such received a lot of assistance from many community service clubs and groups. At Christmas time, people would contact us and tell us about families who needed help.... Perhaps it was themselves, perhaps a neighbor or relative. Each case was investigated to make sure that that family did indeed require help. (You'd be surprised at the number of people who tried to con us). It meant a visit to the home, and it didn't take long to size up the situation. In a two-day period that Christmas I investigated about 150 homes and in my area they all needed help -frequently more help than they were asking for.

Such was the case when I went to visit the Andersons (name changed of course). Someone had told me about this family and had said that they would not ask for help themselves.

They lived on the top floor of a four-story factory building in a two-room unit that had at one time served as an office. The young couple had five children: a baby, twin boys aged four, a girl about six, and another boy about seven. The large main room contained a table and four chairs, two old armchairs, a set of bunk beds. The smaller room had only a double bed. No radio or TV. No carpet. No change of linen.

The husband had been ill for some time and had lost his job in the Maritimes. When he'd recovered, they had travelled to Winnipeg hoping that their luck would change. He now had a job, but the going was rough. There would be no Christmas, Mrs.Anderson told me, but she was sure they would manage.

I took another look around and then I asked her to let me help. Af first she refused until I asked her to look at it not as charity but rather as a loan.

"I know that soon you'll be on your feet. Someday, when you are able, you can repay if you like. It isn't necessary, but if you want to look at it in that light, you can.''

She agreed, and I gave her a list of things I wanted her to pick up from the Salvation Army's shop downtown: another set of bunk beds, a crib, a chesterfield, a new double mattress and some linens. Then I called the Officer in charge at the shop to say Mrs. Anderson was coming in to let her select the items I'd listed and arrange for quick delivery.

I had also given her a food voucher which I knew would help buy a few extra treats for the Christmas table. But it didn't seem enough to me. The General Foods people had held a Christmas Cooking Demonstration at a Winnipeg department store and called to ask if I could use the products of these sessions. This included fantastic, glazed hams, Christmas cookies and such that my people probably only saw in used magazines. And the Kiwanis collected toys from all over the city and asked if I could use some of them. Many of the toys were second hand and had been repaired and repainted by Kiwanis members.

So, armed with a hamper of food and a small selection of toys for the kids, I went back to see Mrs. Anderson. It was Christmas Eve day. Mr. Anderson was working, but the kids were all home. I wish you could have seen their eyes. Yes, they already had the new furniture -- such as it was -- and it alone had made all the difference in the world. But the sight of the toys....it was too much for the mother and she started to cry.

Several weeks later -- it could have been a couple of months, because it was a sunny day, and I don't remember snow - I was walking down Logan Avenue and spotted Mrs. Anderson coming toward me. She was pushing a baby buggy and the twins were

beside her. As they came close, the twins suddenly recognized me.

"Look, Mommy," said one of them, "it's our Santa Claus!!!" I managed to hold

back my tears until after they had gone.

And I wish now I'd told the Kiwanis. Those guys never knew what their efforts meant.






#### In Memorium of our Brother Mike Hart



#### My Grandmother's Maple Cream Fudge submitted by Mike Hart

Ingredients: 1 c brilliant yellow brown sugar 1 c white granulated sugar ½ c whole milk ¼ corn syrup 1 Tbs salted butter 1 tsp real vanilla extract



Then increase heat to medium & amp; let the fudge cook to the soft ball stage or using a candy thermometer 235F or 118C . Soft ball test: drop a small amount into chilled water, it forms a small flexible ball.

Let fudge cool for at least 10 to 15 minutes then add vanilla.

Begin beating fudge till it starts to thicken , then quickly pour into a 9X9 buttered pan. Use a hot knife(run knife under hot water tap) to cut into pieces before fudge cools.

After Mike Hart passed away, I asked Mike Hart's Partner, Mano to share a letter with Spearhead about Mike and his time in Spearhead and Outside Spearhead. Mano sent me this beautiful letter to share with all of our readers.

In Memoriam of my beloved Daddy Mike Mike and I shared 15 wonderful years together, filled with an unshakable bond, fiery passion, and deep love and support. His presence in my life was a constant source of joy and strength. He was the kindest and most generous person I have ever known. I am deeply honoured to have been called his partner—his Boy and I cannot even express how much I miss him. So many tears are streaming down my face as I try to write this ...

The pain of his absence is overwhelming, and I struggle with the realization that I can no longer hold him, hug him, or kiss him. Our apartment feels so eerie and empty without him, especially when I catch myself waiting for him to make me coffee in the morning—a simple act of affection he loved doing for me. I miss hearing the beeps of his scooter in the hallway—a sound that had become unmistakably linked to him in the last couple of years as his walking abilities deteriorated. His infectious, full-hearted laugh echoes in my mind as I reminisce about the days when we would watch our favourite shows together or visit our favourite restaurants. The void in my soul left by his passing feels immense and overpowering, but I know he would want me to be strong and cherish all the amazing times we spent together.

Mike's incredible career in education as a retired music teacher left a lasting impact on many students. He inspired a love of music in countless young minds and was known for his patience, creativity, and Mike's musical expertise passion. extended to his role as the head carillonneur for the University of Toronto, mastering the unique and challenging carillon instrument. His performances were a testament to his skill and dedication, bringing joy to all who heard him play.

Michael was a devoted member of the Metropolitan United Church in Toronto, where he sang in the church choir. His voice was so deep and manly—a beautiful addition to the choir! He would never miss Sunday


Michael was also a recipient of the Spearhead Brotherhood Award, which further reflected his commitment to the community and the deep bonds he formed with Spearhead members.

⅓ cup apple cider vinegar 🎍

¼ cup maple syrup 🍁

1 teaspoon chili powder 🤳 Instructions:

1 Cook Bacon: In a medium skillet over medium heat, cook bacon until crispy. Place bacon on a paper towel-lined plate to drain.

2 Prepare Pan: Leave about ¼ cup of bacon grease in the pan, carefully removing the rest.

5 Serve: Enjoy warm or cold. If refrigerated, warm slightly before serving. ●

#### JALAPENO BACON JAM RECIPE

#### Ingredients:

- 2 cups white chocolate chips
- 1 can (14 oz) sweetened condensed milk
- 1/4 cup butter (unsalted)
- 1/2 cup pineapple juice (from canned pineapple)
- 1/4 cup crushed pineapple, drained
- 1/2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1/2 cup maraschino cherries, chopped 1/4 cup brown sugar (light or dark)

1/4 cup chopped pecans (optional, for garnish) Instructions:

Prepare the Pan: Line an 8x8-inch baking dish with parchment paper or lightly grease it to prevent sticking.


